Midweek Lenten Services

We have just 1 more Midweek Lenten Service, April 9th, before we start Holy week. Each year, the Christian church embarks on a forty-day journey leading up to Easter, known as the season of Lent. Our theme this year is *The Hand of the Lord*. So far this Lenten Season we have looked at The Hand of the Lord Who Creates and Saves, The Hand of the Lord Who Casts Out Demons, The Hand of the Lord Who Heals the Sick and The Hand of the Lord who Raises the Dead. On April 9th, we will hear about the Hand of the Lord Who Holds All Things, and on Maundy Thursday about the Hand of the Lord Who Serves and Feeds Us. On the 9th we will also be holding our last Lenten meal with serving from 5:30 to 6:15 p.m. There is a sign-up sheet in the narthex, please sign up where you can. Bowls, plates, cups, disposable silverware, crackers, butter, etc. will be provided. Please have your food to the church basement by 5:15. This is a self-serve meal so you can come anytime between 5:30 and 6:15 to eat. Those who choose to eat will need to clean up their table as they leave and dispose of their table service in the trash before heading upstairs for worship. Please join us and invite others to attend with you!

Our Lenten/Easter Schedule at St. John

- + Sunday, April 6th at 9:00 a.m. The 5th Sunday in Lent
- + Remaining Midweek Lenten Services April 9th at 6:30 p.m.
- + Palm Sunday, April 13th at 9:00 a.m. We will meet in the narthex and process in with palm branches. We will hear from Scripture about the crowd gathering to greet Jesus as he rode into Jerusalem on a donkey, laying palm branches and cloaks across the road, giving Jesus the royal treatment with shouts of "Hosanna to the Son of David. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest." St. John Sewing Group will have their quilts on display on the back of the pews that morning.
- + Maundy Thursday, April 17th, at 7:00 p.m. At this service we celebrate Holy Communion. At the end of the service the altar is stripped bare, just as in the case of fasting, we give things up to subdue our flesh and enhance our joy when they return.
- + **Prayer Vigil** being held during the hours of Jesus' suffering and crucifixion, starting after worship on Maundy Thursday and continuing until 3:00 p.m. on Good Friday. Lots of ½ hour time slots to fill yet, sign up in the narthex. Prayer materials are available.
- + Good Friday, April 18th, at 7:00 p.m. We will hear the passion story and will hear the closing of the tomb, leaving the service in darkness and silence.
- + Easter Vigil Service, April 19th, at 6:00 p.m. The Easter Vigil connects the days of Holy Week with the culminating celebration of the resurrection of Christ from the dead. We gather to wait in expectation for the news of Christ's resurrection and for His second coming. Other pastors from our circuit will be involved in this service.
- + **Easter Breakfast** Sunday morning April 20th with serving from 7:30 to 8:45 a.m. This will be a freewill donation breakfast with proceeds being used to help with expenses incurred by our member, Noah Barr and Pastor Schultz who will be attending the National Youth Gathering in New Orleans in July.
- + Easter Celebration Service April 20th, at 9:00 a.m. We will be celebrating the resurrection of our Savior, Jesus Christ at this Divine Service.

Sewing Group Quilts to Be on Display

The Quilting/Sewing Group here at St. John have met each Tuesday since January to work on guilts for Lutheran World Relief, fundraisers, seminary students, and other service organizations in and around Iowa. These quilts will be displayed on Palm Sunday here at the church. If you desire, you may purchase a displayed guilt for a free-will donation, with proceeds being used to offset shipping costs. These shipping costs have raised significantly since 2020. It costs \$2.80 per quilt to ship overseas and each baby kit cost \$3.10 to ship. In 2024, 370,818 guilts and 45,690 baby kits were shipped to those in need through Lutheran World Relief to 16 countries! Before being shipped out, the guilts that were sewn here at St. John will be taken to the Keystone Nursing Care Center for the residents to admire. After that, the guilts and kits will be boxes up and will be taken to the pickup point in Cedar Rapids to be delivered to a LWR shipping warehouse in preparation for overseas shipping. If you'd like to make a donation to help offset those shipping costs, there will be a basket in the narthex on Palm Sunday, or mark an envelope and drop it in the offering plate.

Camp Io-Dis-E-Ca Summer Camp

What do you think of when you think of "open arms?" Songs by Journey or Creed? What about welcoming people or even strength or salvation? This year's camp theme *With Open Arms* aims to construct a clear and resolute image for us Christians. We will focus on how God has been at work in this creation to gather a people, with open arms, to be His own treasured possession. Sometimes that work of God is displayed in strength and wonder, as with Samson or Israel's crossing of the Red Sea. Sometimes God's work has been a great display of compassion and forgiveness, as Jesus taught his disciples in the Parable of the Prodigal Son. Ultimately, we look to Jesus' death on the Cross as the primary place where God works to gather a people, just as Jesus tells us in John 3:15. This great work of God to gather a people with open arms continues to this very day in the proclamation of the Gospel and the calling of all to faith in Christ alone.

Campers have no shortage of things to do while at camp. Being that the programs accommodate campers in kindergarten up to high school seniors, the summer camp program features activities suitable for elementary campers as well as advanced activities for older campers. Included are canoeing, archery, rock climbing, zip line, challenge course, horseback riding, swimming, hayrack rides, canoe trips, bike trips, parachute games, skits, gaga ball, bouldering wall, disc golf, hikes, human football, sand volleyball, 9 square, and various other sports.

Our 2025 Missions

Our "mission" envelopes this year will be divided between Camp Io-Dis-E-Ca and the support of the Rev. Jason Groth, missionary to Belize.

Camp Io-Dis-E-Ca is a year-round camp, retreat center, and public family campground affiliated with Iowa District East/LCMS. In a unique outdoor setting, campers are given an opportunity to begin and end each day with the Word of God and prayer, learn more about Jesus Christ through Bible study, make lasting Christian friendships, sing camp songs, learn a variety of recreation skills, and enjoy their favorite all-camp games with new friends.

Our 2nd mission is the support of Pastor Jason Groth doing missionary work in Belize. Pastor Groth and his family are still in the Dominican Republic and will be until May where they seek to understand what it means to be a pastor, to be the church, to be God's people, in Latin America. One of the largest parts of their training is to speak Spanish, the language of the people and also to learn the culture and perspective of the people from Latin America. Swaddling Clothes

Our next Swaddling Clothes Shopping Day will be held on Saturday, April 12th, with shopping from 9 a.m. until noon. If you can't make it then, we will also be open on Monday, the 14th, from 4:30 until 5:30 p.m. (Please note the time change.) There are no income guidelines to follow. We just ask that you have children in your custody either by birth or court order. We offer a sleeve of diapers and baby wipes each month to everyone who comes in and is in need of them. This month we are offering our Spring/Summer clothing so

we are hoping for a larger-than-normal turnout.

We really appreciate our volunteers who come in to help us out when needed. It takes a lot of time and extra hands to switch out the clothing from winter to summer. If you'd like to help with Swaddling Clothes, please contact the church office or Darla Kromminga. Our need now is for people to take a laundry basket or two as we are washing our summer clothing before it gets hung or folded for those coming in to see. The baskets are located under the table in the narthex as you come up the stairs. When you have finished laundering, just return to the church.

We have been blessed by Concordia Publishing House in partnership with Concordia Gospel Outreach to gift each family with one Arch book per week, free of charge, who come in to shop. That means that on each shopping day we will be giving each family 4 books! At the end of the year each family should have 52 Arch Books sharing the Word of Our Lord. What a wonderful library to have in their home!

We appreciate children's clothing sz. newborn to sz. 10, and any items that would be used for raising children, like strollers, cribs, pack n' plays, highchairs, car seats, blankets, sheets, pacifiers, etc. If you'd like to donate but don't have the clothing, baby items, etc., here are some other needs we have. We need zipper bags sandwich through jumbo size, batteries (AA, AAA, C, and D), baby wipes, diapers, Pull-Ups for both boys and girls, baby wash, and diaper cream.
