Vacation Bible School Update

Vacation Bible School was held July 28 through August 1 from 9:00 to 11:30 a.m. This year's theme was *An Epic Australian Adventure*. It was a fun time for kids as they learned about our Savior with a lesson, craft, music, snacks, and games each session. We had 36 children attend this year! The kids brought in offerings each day and that money will be sent to Pastor Groth for his mission in Belize. The challenge for the kiddos was to bring in \$200 in offerings for the week. If the \$200 was reached, one kid would be chosen to push a pie in Pastor Schultz' face. For each \$100 over that amount another kid would also get to pie him in the face. The kids brought in a total of \$500 (4 pies worth) that will be sent to Pastor Groth's mission!

On Sunday, August 3rd, during our worship service the VBS kids will be singing a couple of songs that they learned during VBS week with an invitation for parents to come along also. There will be snacks served in the narthex following the service.

There are <u>so many</u> people to thank and we certainly don't want to miss naming anyone. We especially want to thank Pastor Schultz for providing the opening and closing each day and to Mary Sievers who is St. John's Children's Spiritual Growth chairperson for coordinating the VBS this year. We had so many volunteers who took their part and just did awesome, whether teaching the Bible lessons, practicing the music, providing awesome games, crafts, and bringing in and serving some delicious snacks. We also thank the parents who took time out of their day to see that their children could attend. God's blessings to you all!

Quarterly Voters' Meeting

A Quarterly Voters' Meeting was held on Sunday, July 27th, following our worship service. On the agenda for old business was the property and equipment that needed attention. Most of the items on the list have been addressed and completed. Swaddling Clothes Update



A Swaddling Clothes "Shopping Day" will be held on Saturday, August 9th, from 9 a.m. until noon, and on Monday, August 11th, from 4:30 until 5:30 p.m. We had 30 families come in for the month of July to get what they needed for their children. We are always in need of donations of gently used, stain-free clothing and baby care items. Without donations, this program would not be possible. Call the church office at 319-442-3514 to arrange a convenient drop off plan.

Each month at Swaddling Clothes we offer gently used clothing from size newborn up to size 10, along with our usual baby and motherhood items including maternity clothes. There are no income guidelines to follow, everyone is welcome to come in and shop. Everything is free! We just ask that those coming in to shop have children in their custody either by birth or by court order. We offer a sleeve of diapers and baby wipes each month to those who comes in for each of their children in need of them.

If you are a mom preparing for school to begin, please keep Swaddling Clothes in mind when sorting your child's clothing. Another help would be to watch clearance items in your favorite retail store. Items get marked down tremendously if they aren't selling or are out of season. We have several families with school-aged children who will need school clothing and we would love your donations!

We are collecting school supplies for our families to pick up during our August shopping days. Thank you to all for the generous donations!

Again, we want to thank all the volunteers who take baskets of clothing home to launder. There are several of them located in the narthex as we will be changing to our fall/winter clothing starting in September.

It provides families with monthly food boxes containing \$40 worth of nutritious items like fruits, vegetables, dairy, grains, and proteins. Every child deserves access to healthy food. Virginia Gay Hospital is proud to partner with Benton Community and Vinton-Shellsburg Schools to support families this summer. This is a simple, community supported program designed to make summer a little easier for families. Food is available once per month with the last distribution being held on August 7th from 4-7 p.m. at Benton Community High School, 600 1st Street, Van Horne, near the gym doors, and at Vinton Shellsburg High School, 210 W. 21st Street, Vinton, on the east side of the school. You will get up to \$40 worth of healthy groceries for each of your school-age children. There is no income paperwork stress, just a simple form to fill out at the site and you're good to go. New Partnership Begins in Valley of Peace

Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ for the joyful work He is doing in Belize!

We're excited to share the launch of a new mercy outreach: the Mobile Mercy House, a collaborative ministry between El Buen Pastor Lutheran Church and the Inspiration Center in Belize City. Through this partnership, six children with disabilities are now receiving regular physical therapy close to home-bringing care, dignity, and the love of Christ directly into their community.

This work of mercy is not separate from the mission of the Churchit is part of it. As we serve our neighbors in body and soul, we bear witness to the compassion of Jesus and invite them into His Church. Each monthly Mercy House visit includes the proclamation of the Gospel and prayer with a pastor or church member. In this way, acts of mercy are the soil in which the Church takes root.

Between Mercy House days, families continue to receive care through in-home visits from Pastor Flores or another mission pastor. These visits deepen relationships, foster trust, and open doors for ongoing witness. As Lutheran churches are planted and grow in these communities, the Gospel spreads-reaching hearts not only with words, but with the living love of Christ.

I'm also learning the ins and outs of coordinating Camp Concordia-2.5 acres with seven buildings, all needing regular maintenance and care.


