Quarterly Voters' Meeting with the Election of the 2026 Church Council

The Giving Tree

Once again it will soon be time to set up our "Giving Tree". This has become a wonderful service project for St.

John with the spirit of giving reaching out into the community. The tree will be set up around Thanksgiving. Our goal is to make Christmas special for those less fortunate, not only with a gift but a gift with a Christian message attached to it. We will be placing names on the tree from children around Benton County. Names of children whose parents will be struggling to provide their children with gifts. There are a few ways you can help:

- 1) If you don't care to shop, you can make a donation and have the committee do the shopping for you. If you choose this option, please <u>DO NOT</u> take a name from the tree. Donations may be dropped off or mailed to the church office or placed in the offering plate clearly marked with "Giving Tree".
- 2) You can take a name (or names) from the tree. On the back of the Christmas Card ornament that you take from the tree there is a pocket that contains information with gift suggestions, including sizes. These are suggestions, purchase what you wish from the list. There is also a name tag label included in the pocket which needs to be attached to your wrapped gift before it is placed back under the tree. Exact date as to when we need the gifts back isn't known yet. Watch bulletins for more info.
- 3) You can call in to the church (442-3514) and you can specify what age group, sex of child, etc. that you would like to buy for and we can pull a card off the tree for you and send a picture of it via text, email, or USPS, then you can shop and return the gift to us.
- 4) We are working on including the Food Baskets like we did last year. The basket will feed a family of 6 a Christmas Dinner. At this time we are unsure of the cost of the baskets. Watch upcoming announcements.

Each year we have helped many less fortunate individuals in the area - Serving the Lord by serving others. The committee will be meeting in November at a date not yet determined, to set things up.
