## Epiphany - January 6th

December 25 (Christmas Day) begins the 'season' of Christmas which lasts 12 days until the festival of Epiphany on January 6. Epiphany, along with Easter and Pentecost is one of the three oldest and most important festivals observed by the early Christian church. The word Epiphany comes from the Greek word *epiphania* which can be translated as **appearing**. Epiphany has a variety of meanings closely related to one another; the shining of a light, a manifestation, an appearance, or a revelation. Epiphany "illuminates" or reveals to us the divinity of our Lord who was made known to the whole world for the first time by the visit of the magi from the east. There is no mention of how many wise men visited but tradition says three, probably because there were three gifts mentioned (gold, frankincense and myrrh). The Hebrews expected for centuries a star as sign of the birth of the Messiah. It was the shining of the light (the star) that brought the magi to Jesus who is the "a light for revelation to the Gentiles" Luke 2:32. Epiphany is a festival day of light and is denoted by the liturgical color **white**. It ushers in the season of Epiphany which lasts until the beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday. Jesus said of himself, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." (John 8:12) Here at St. John, we will be observing The Epiphany of Our Lord during our Sunday, January 4th, worship service.

### Swaddling Clothes Update

Our next *Swaddling Clothes* “shopping day” is scheduled for the second Saturday of the month which is Saturday, January 10th, with shopping from 9 a.m. to noon. For those who can’t attend on Saturday, we will be open on Monday afternoon, January 12th, from 4:30 until 5:30 p.m.

We are taking donations of good, gently used winter children’s clothing size newborn to size 10, along with maternity clothing, and items used for raising children, like highchairs, cribs, baby swings, etc. If you’d like to donate but don’t have the clothing, baby items, etc., here are some other needs we have. We need zipper bags sandwich through jumbo size, batteries (AA, AAA, C, and D), baby wipes, diapers, Pull-Ups for both boys and girls, baby wash, and diaper cream. Here are a few other ways to help out our Swaddling Clothes program:

\*Drop off unwanted household items and furniture at Stuff, Etc. Consignment Store in Cedar Rapids. Swaddling Clothes has a “charitable store account” there. What this means is that you can bring in your gently used, unwanted items to the Stuff, Etc-Cedar Rapids location and donate your items under Swaddling Clothes-St. John Lutheran Church, Keystone account #36081. This is an opportunity for you to purge unwanted household items, and furniture and help Swaddling Clothes raise money for ongoing expenses. After your items are sold, a portion of each sale is deposited into the Swaddling Clothes consignment account. We can use the money as store credit at Stuff, Etc to purchase needed items or withdraw the money to purchase needed items elsewhere. Keep in mind that we still need your maternity clothes, newborn thru size 10 children’s clothes and any baby-care related items to be brought here to the church for our “shopping days”.

\*Pass along unwanted gift cards and coupons to Swaddling Clothes. We may be able to use them to benefit Swaddling Clothes.

\*When out shopping, ask yourself if Swaddling Clothes could benefit from some of the sale, clearance items.

\*Use your reward points or rebate cash to purchase baby-care items. A couple of great examples of this is something like Kohl’s Cash. Rather than letting it expire without using it, perhaps pick up something that Swaddling Clothes could use or Menard’s 11% rebate that provides in store credit to make purchases. That could be used to purchase toothbrushes or stocking hats, etc.

\*If you are a Thrivent member, perhaps you can form a Thrivent Action Team to purchase items needed by Swaddling Clothes.

\*Most of all, please pray for the Swaddling Clothes program that we may continue to provide items that some can’t afford to purchase on their own.

If you have any questions about the above information, please feel free to ask a member of the committee or contact the church office.

We are so thankful for the group of volunteers that we have who come in when asked and help sort, clean, repair items, repackaging diapers, write thank you notes to those who donate, etc.

We are also thankful to those who donate. We know how quickly kids outgrow their clothing. We receive some beautiful, almost brand-new clothing. We couldn’t keep going if it weren’t for donations!

We have some interesting stats to share with you about what has happened at *Swaddling Clothes* in 2025. Over the year, 426 families came in to shop, with 41 of those being first-time shoppers. During 2025, we gave out 598 packages of baby wipes. (Each of those packages of wipes contains 100 wipes, so that’s 59,800 wipes for 2025!) We also gave out 557 packages of diapers/Pull-ups with each package holding 20 diapers/pull-ups so that’s a total of 11,400! During the months of October through December, a total of 87 coats were given away. Many of those coats were brand-new because of shoppers who found year-end bargains to donate the year before. Surprisingly, our busiest month was September with 44 families coming in to shop. Our slowest month for 2025 was February when 26 families were helped.

To God be the Glory for this awesome mission here at St. John. In September of 2026, we will celebrate our 7th anniversary!

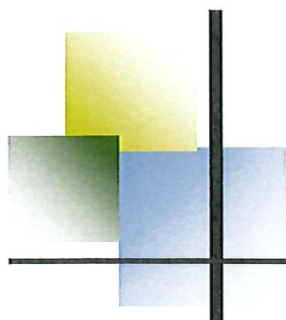
