

Reformation Day

We will be observing Reformation Day on Sunday, October 26th, here at St. John. Here is a bit of history about Reformation Day.

On October 31, 1517, an Augustinian monk posted ninety-five statements for discussion on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. Dr. Martin Luther hoped that posting his theses would bring about an academic debate regarding repentance, the sale of indulgences, and other matters of concern within the Roman Catholic Church. However, Rome eventually excommunicated Luther, judging him to be a heretic. Luther's reforms, centered on the teaching that a believer is justified by grace through faith in Jesus Christ, sparked religious reforms not only in the German states but also in many European countries. In 1667, Elector John George II of Saxony standardized the custom of observing Luther's October 31 posting of the Ninety-five Theses.

Pastor Appreciation Month

Did you know that October is Pastor Appreciation Month? Pastor Appreciation Month (originally called Clergy Appreciation Month) was established in 1992 by a group of pastors and church leaders to honor those who serve in ministry. They grounded the celebration in Paul's words to Timothy: "The elders who direct the affairs of the church well are worthy of double honor, especially those whose work is preaching and teaching" (1 Tim. 5:17). No, it's not an official holiday, but it is nationally recognized, like Boss Appreciation Day and Administrative Assistant Day. And chances are, most pastors are thinking about it this month. Pastors who serve with proper motives feel like they can't say anything about Pastor Appreciation Month—especially to those in their own churches. Doing so would seem grossly self-serving. So, this is being written by Donna, without Pastor's knowledge. Can you imagine our pastor stepping up to the pulpit on Sunday and saying, "Good morning, church. Before I begin my sermon, I want to remind you this month is Pastor Appreciation Month. And, if you're wondering, I'd love some gift cards to Starbucks"? Of course not. Most pastors are trying their best to serve and lead and pray and listen and preach and love as faithfully as they can. Everyone needs a little encouragement now and then. That includes our pastor.

2026 Church Council Election

Our election for the 2026 Church Council is quickly approaching. The election will be held during the Quarterly Voters' Meeting to be held here at St. John on October 19th. At the present time, we have 9 members on the church council, Jordan Silhanek, Ann Franzenburg, Doug Buch, Mary Sievers, Richard Oehlerich, Kent Silhanek, Barbara Hennings, Byran Kimm, and Adrieonna Reddick. The terms of two council members expire this year: Jordan Silhanek and Ann Franzenburg, both have served one 3-year term and can run again if they wish. Our by-laws state that "the Church Council shall be comprised of not less than seven members and no more than eleven members" which means that if these 2 council members decide to run again we still have room to elect up to as many as two more members. If Jordan and Ann decide not to run again, we would have room for four new members.

While people may express their desire to serve, having you nominate people allows you to identify those whom you think would serve well. Of course, people who are nominated will be asked if they would like to serve if elected.

We are therefore seeking your suggestions or nominations. Pray about these positions. Perhaps encourage the people whose names you wrote and explain why you nominated them. The Nominating Committee will contact all nominees to get their approval to have their names submitted for the election in October.


