Senior Recognition Sunday



A Senior Recognition Sunday was held on Sunday, May 18th, during our worship service. This year we had just 1 graduating senior, Kayla Lennie. Kayla plans to attend the University of Iowa and major with an interest in Nursing. A brief reception for Kayla was held in the narthex following our worship service. Stained Glass Repair Project

A special Voters' Meeting is planned for <u>Sunday</u>, <u>June 1st</u>, immediately following our worship so that the stained glass repair project can be addressed. Since this repair is estimated at over the \$10,000 limit that the church council can spend without voter approval, the meeting is required.

It was brought to our attention by a visitor to our church recently that our Gethsemane stained glass window had a bulge in it, noticeable mainly in the burgundy color of Jesus' robe. We were able to find a stain-glass expert, located in the Grimes area. He came out to inspect the window on May 5th. He told us that these stained glass windows usually last around 100 years before needing some form of restoration. He recommended a full and complete restoration of the bulging window, which means removing the window from its opening and taking it to his shop. In the shop, they will need to take the window apart and build it back together using new lead. which will be the same size, color, and profile of the existing material. They will replace any broken pieces that they come across with the best match possible, and the original glass will be cleaned and polished in the process. The window will then be cemented with stained-glass putty that will make the window strong and waterproof. New re-enforcing steel bars will be soldered directly onto the lead. When done, they will install the stained-glass window in its frame and glaze it in which should extend its life another 100+ years! The estimated time frame to complete this process is 2-3 weeks. The cost estimate for this work is \$13,540 plus tax.

Back in the '70's, a plexiglas-type storm window was put on the outside of each window for protection from the elements. The whole window was covered with the exception of the 2 small vent windows located at the bottom of each window allowing them to be opened.

The wood around the outside area of these small windows is exposed to the weather. The wood is getting quite shabby-looking and needs to have something done to it. The council is recommending that we paint the exposed wood one last time and then have the windows covered with the plexiglas material, which would eliminate the need to paint them every few years. This would also mean; however, that the windows could no longer be opened. The company would do this for \$148 + tax per each small window, of which we have 10. There is also one window sill that is rotting and needs to be replaced. They can repair that for around \$250 if it's done at the same time the work on the Gethsemane window is done so that an extra trip doesn't need to be made.

Please stay for this meeting as the decision is made of how to proceed with preserving our beautiful stained glass windows!

An Elder's Meeting will be held on Sunday, June 1st, at 7:30 a.m. in the overflow area of the education wing. The purpose of our Board of Elders is to be a liaison between the church and our pastor. Of course, Pastor Schultz is available anytime to meet with you about issues in the church. Orphan Grain Train

A group of people from the church will be heading to Clemons, Iowa, on Tuesday, June 3rd, to deliver clothing that has been collected here at St. John and to volunteer for the morning, sorting and boxing up clothing to be shipped where needed. If you'd like to go along, please contact Susie Albers or the church office. The plan is to leave Keystone around 8 a.m. that morning and we usually arrive back around 2 p.m.

A little bit about the Orphan Grain Train. OGT is a 501c3 nonprofit Christian volunteer network that shares personal and material resources with needy people in America and around the World. OGT is a recognized service organization (RSO) of the LCMS. Many shipments have been in cooperation with Lutheran Hour Ministries, LCMS World Mission, LCMS World Relief, and other Christian ministries. Volunteers gather donations of clothing, medical supplies, food, Christian literature, and other aid to meet real needs. The Orphan Grain Train movement is a loving response to Jesus Christ's example as a servant and His love for us.

OGT has 27 regional locations. Since 1992, they have delivered more than 50.3 million fortified-rice meals and 4,504 shipments of humanitarian aid to needy people in several states and 71 countries on 5 continents. What a great service to many!

We just ask that you have children in your custody either by birth or court order. We offer a sleeve of diapers and baby wipes each month to everyone who comes in and is in need of them for their children.

We really appreciate our volunteers who come in to help us out when needed. If you'd like to help with Swaddling Clothes, please contact the church office or Darla Kromminga. Our need now is for people to take a laundry basket or two as we wash the donations coming in. The baskets are located under the table in the narthex as you come up the stairs. When you have finished laundering, just return to the church.

We have been blessed by Concordia Publishing House in partnership with Concordia Gospel Outreach to gift each family with one Arch book per week, free of charge, who come in to shop. That means that on each shopping day we will be giving each family 4 books! At the end of the year each family should have 52 Arch Books sharing the Word of Our Lord. What a wonderful library to have in their home!

We appreciate children's clothing sz. newborn to sz. 10, and any items that would be used for raising children, like strollers, cribs, pack n' plays, highchairs, car seats, blankets, sheets, pacifiers, etc. If you'd like to donate but don't have the clothing, baby items, etc., here are some other needs we have. Well, that's a wrap on the 58th year of CLS ministry for the 2024-2025 school year! What a blessing to educate and minister to 177 Preschool through 8th grade students! Thank you congregations for your support and help in the ministry of sharing God's Word with His children and their families!

Enrollment for the 2025-2026 School Year - as of 5/27: PS-33, Kindergarten-23 (1 seat left), 1st grade - 24 (full!), 2nd grade-19 (5 seats left), 3rd grade-13, 4th grade-24 (full!), 5th grade -18, 6th grade -17, 7th grade -14, 8th grade -10 (K-8=162; PS-8=195) Our enrollment is up from this current year, however, we still have seats where children can hear about Jesus and His world everyday in every subject. Please help us in encouraging your friends and neighbors to at least have a tour of our facilities and ask about attending next school year.

ESA/Student First Information -

If you have any questions - please come and visit with me.

All students are eligible to enroll for the 2025-2026 school year! Parents must enroll by June 30, 2025. Funds will be dispersed to accredited nonpublic schools in July once all verifications have been completed. Any parents not applying for ESA's by the June 30th deadline, will be expected to pay the \$7,826 tuition amount over 9 months (\$870 a month).

CLS Office Hours for June: I will be here at school working in the office on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday from 9-2. If you need anything or have any questions, please stop in and see me. You can always reach me on my cell phone, leave a message on the school phone, or email me at principal@centrallutheranschool.org.
