A Quarterly Voters' Meeting was held on Sunday, April 27th, following worship. On the agenda were some items that need repair or are being worked on in and around the church and parsonage. 1) New door is being installed in the kitchen entrance, 2) mini-split issue is being looked at regarding lack of heat to Pastor's office, 3) Gethsemane stained glass window has a bubble in it, 4) parsonage alley garage needs some updating, 5) doors to education wing need painting, 6) wood around exterior of stained glass windows needs painting, 7) organ repair, 8) work on rain leaking in on the ramp area, 9) water damage in parsonage basement due to leaking water heater, 10) stairway runner needed for the parsonage steps going upstairs, 11) old fire extinguishers replaced around the church and parsonage with fire blankets purchased for kitchen at the parsonage and the downstairs kitchen at the church. There was no other new business. Missions paid out the first quarter of 2025: Camp Io-Dis-E-Ca - \$225.00; Rev. Jason Groth, Missionary to Belize - \$425.00; Zach Johnson - \$300.00; LCMS Disaster Relief - \$200.00; Orphan Grain Train - \$100.00. Meeting adjourned.

Swaddling Clothes

Our next Swaddling Clothes Shopping Day will be held on Saturday, May 10th, with shopping from 9 a.m. until noon. If you can't make it then, we will also be open on Monday, the 12th, from 4:30 until 5:30 p.m. There are no income guidelines to follow. We just ask that you have children in your custody either by birth or court order. We offer a sleeve of diapers and baby wipes each month to everyone who comes in and is in need of them for their children.

We really appreciate our volunteers who come in to help us out when needed. If you'd like to help with Swaddling Clothes, please contact the church office or Darla Kromminga. Our need now is for people to take a laundry basket or two as we wash the new donations coming in. The baskets are located under the table in the narthex as you come up the stairs. When you have finished laundering, just return to the church.

We have been blessed by Concordia Publishing House in partnership with Concordia Gospel Outreach to gift each family with one Arch book per week, free of charge, who come in to shop. That means that on each shopping day we will be giving each family 4 books! At the end of the year each family should have 52 Arch Books sharing the Word of Our Lord. What a wonderful library to have in their home!

On Sunday, May 11th, we will have the opportunity to hear about Poblo International Ministries. Rev. Tim Bickel, who is an ambassador for the organization, will be with us here at St. John. Rev. Bickel graduated from Concordia Seminary, St. Louis in 1971 and served Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod parishes in Illinois, Alaska, Washington, Oregon, and Michigan until 2008 when he retired. Both as a volunteer summer teacher and since retirement as a contract teacher during school years, he has taught English in Asia. He also co-led a theological seminar in Ethiopia in 2002. For 16 years, he was a volunteer firefighter and designated chaplain in Washington and Oregon. In Oregon, he coordinated and conducted crisis debriefings to help keep emergency personnel in health service. Tim sees himself as a grateful servant of Jesus Christ. He has a passion to be and bring the good news to all. He has cross-cultural experience at home and abroad. And now, he is humbled and honored to join POBLO, bringing together God's people and foreign newcomers in response to Christ's Great Commission (Mark 16:15). Pastor Bickel will be leading us in worship as well as discussing the Poblo International Ministry during our Bible Study hour following worship. At the present time, Pastor Bickel is also serving as the vacancy pastor at St. Mark Lutheran Church in Garrison.

Camp Io-Dis-E-Ca Summer Camp

What do you think of when you think of "open arms?" Songs by Journey or Creed? What about welcoming people or even strength or salvation? This year's camp theme *With Open Arms* aims to construct a clear and resolute image for us Christians. We will focus on how God has been at work in this creation to gather a people, with open arms, to be His own treasured possession. Sometimes that work of God is displayed in strength and wonder, as with Samson or Israel's crossing of the Red Sea. Sometimes God's work has been a great display of compassion and forgiveness, as Jesus taught his disciples in the Parable of the Prodigal Son. Ultimately, we look to Jesus' death on the Cross as the primary place where God works to gather a people, just as Jesus tells us in John 3:15. This great work of God to gather a people with open arms continues to this very day in the proclamation of the Gospel and the calling of all to faith in Christ alone.

Campers have no shortage of things to do while at camp. Being that the programs accommodate campers in kindergarten up to high school seniors, the summer camp program features activities suitable for elementary campers as well as advanced activities for older campers.
